Reports: The 700 block of Fulton Street, paving project will begin within the next few weeks. A notice will be provided to property owner's along the route and a general notice for road closure will also be posted once the project timeline is provided by the engineer & contractor. Council will plan to complete a town tour in March or April and send out spring cleanup notices for junk and junk vehicles. The trail lights will be on from dusk till dawn. The speed trailer will be brought in town by the Sheriff's office once it is available from another town. The alley stormwater improvement is complete and working well behind the community center. The ditch has been dug along Washington street and is flowing. As a reminder, citizens are asked to pick up after their pets in town and particularly at the city park. Compost cleanup will be added to the September agenda to discuss hiring a contractor/excavator to complete a project to regrade the compost area in addition to adding updated cameras to be installed to prosecute illegal dumping occuring at the compost pile.
