

**CITY OF GRAND MOUND  
MINUTES OF WORK SESSION  
MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING  
APRIL 9, 2012**

A work session regarding bid letting for Sanitary Sewer System Upgrade was called to order by Mayor Behr at 6:50 p.m. at City Hall. Recommendations by City Engineer Alice Ohrtmann from IIW Engineers were discussed as follows:

Contract A Sanitary Sewer Lining low bid is Municipal Pipe Tool in the amount of \$409,145 and low bid for Contract B Sanitary Sewer System Upgrades is Tschiggfrie Excavating in the amount of \$138,555.10.

Mayor Behr declared the Hearing adjourned at 7:00.

Motion by Crosthwaite, second to by Guy to deny Variance request Ordinance 55.01.04 Livestock, which would allow chickens in a residential area. Ayes: all.

Motion by Warren, second by Lawson to approve Contract B Sanitary Sewer Upgrade with Tschiggfrie Construction and to authorize Mayor to sign documents. Aye: all.


Motion by Beuthien, second by Crosthwaite to approve Contract A Sanitary Sewer Upgrade with Municipal Pipe Tool and to authorize Mayor to sign documents. Aye: all.

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City Clerk reported that a letter sent to a semi-truck owner regarding Truck Route had been protested. Council responded that the ordinance regarding Truck Routes had been put into effect following IDOT Recommendations regarding width of streets and intersections. Streets or corners should be wide enough to accommodate trucks without damaging storm drains, culverts or private property. Concern was also expressed about the weight effect on the streets.
